TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (3-6-1-0) start a three-game road trip with a contest against the Milwaukee Admirals (7-2-2-0) tonight at UW-Milwaukee Panther Arena. The Stars will face three different Central Division foes over the next four days.

Winners of three of their last four, the Stars are coming off a weekend split against the Manitoba Moose in Cedar Park, after sweeping the Moose the weekend prior up in Winnipeg. On Friday, the Stars scored four unanswered goals in a 4-1 victory for their first home win of the season. Manitoba pulled out a 3-2 win in the rematch Saturday.

The Admirals earned points in six straight games (6-0-1) before dropping their contest last night to Manitoba 3-1, with Cole O'Hara securing the only marker of the game for Milwaukee.

LAST TIME OUT

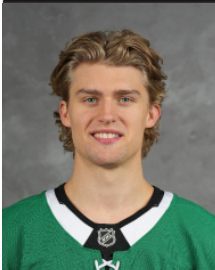
The Texas Stars suffered a 3-2 setback against the Manitoba Moose on Saturday night at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park.

Texas got on the board first. With just under five minutes to go in the first period, **Cross Hanas** raced to a loose puck for a breakaway, slipping it between the legs of Thomas Milic for his second goal of the season. Just over two minutes after Hanas' marker, **Cameron Hughes** fired a pass to **Harrison Scott** in the slot. The forward's snipe doubled the Texas lead to 2-0 after one.

Moose forward David Gustafsson scored at the start of the second period to cut the Stars lead to 2-1. The Stars had a goal called off later in the frame that would've made it 3-1, but was deemed to be kicked in.

Manitoba scored two goals in 25 seconds in the middle of the third period. Markers from Fabian Wagner and Colby Barlow gave the Moose the 3-2 lead, which they held on to for the victory. Thomas Milic stopped 22 Stars shots in the win, while **Remi Poirier** saved 27 of 30 in the loss.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT



Texas forward **Cross Hanas** scored the first goal of last Saturday's game against Manitoba. The Dallas native is tied for second on the team with two goals and four points. He previously scored Oct. 11 against Grand Rapids, his former team, on Opening Weekend. Before returning to his home state, Hanas spent the last three seasons with the Griffins, compiling 50 points (26-24=50) in 146 games. The 6-foot-1 winger signed a professional tryout with the Stars on Sept. 10, 2025 and was originally drafted by Detroit in the second round in 2020.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

Tonight marks the second of an eight-game season series between the Stars and Admirals and the second of four meetings at UW-Milwaukee Panther Arena. Texas returns to Wisconsin on Feb. 18 and Feb. 20. Milwaukee makes its way to the Lone Star State on Dec. 19-20 and Jan. 3-4.

The two teams split the season series in 2024-25, with both teams winning three of their four road games. Milwaukee narrowly edged Texas by two points in the regular season standings, but the Stars prevailed in the deciding game of the best-of-five Central Division Final playoff series.

SERIES HISTORY

Texas and Milwaukee have met 89 times in history, with the Stars boasting a 47-29-8-5 all-time record.

The Stars own a 20-17-3-5 all-time record against the Admirals in Milwaukee, after going 3-4-0-1 last season. Texas has outscored Milwaukee 268-252 in the all-time series.

The two teams have collided in the Calder Cup Playoffs five different times, including each of the last three years. The Admirals won in 2011, 2023 and 2024, while Texas beat Milwaukee in the postseason in 2013 and 2025.

NEWS & NOTES

ARE YOU REMI FOR IT?

Texas goaltender **Remi Poirier** has been one of the biggest reasons for the Stars getting their season back on track. He has started five straight games for Texas dating back to Oct. 25 vs Iowa. During that five-game span, Poirier has allowed six goals and sports a .955 save percentage, including a 25-save shutout on Nov. 3 at Manitoba.

Overall this season, Poirier's 2.02 goals-against average is good for sixth in the AHL, and is 7th in save percentage at a .925 clip. With Poirier's win on Nov. 7 vs. Manitoba, he now has 46 wins in his Texas Stars career, tied for third in team history with Christopher Nilstorp. He is eight wins from second place, held by Jack Campbell.

PENALTY KILLERS

Texas' penalty kill has been on a roll since their 2-0 setback on Oct. 24 vs Iowa when they allowed two power play goals. Since the second period of that game, the Stars have killed off 16 of their last 17 penalties, including a stretch of 13 straight, which held up until David Gustafsson's marker early in the second period last Saturday against Manitoba.

Hand-in-hand with the Stars' improved penalty kill lately, they are also one of the most disciplined teams in the AHL. Through 10 games they have been shorthanded just 32 times, the fewest in the league.

Back on Oct. 18 when Texas and Milwaukee last met, the Admirals scored two power play goals in three opportunities, with Matthew Wood and Zach L'Heureux earning those markers. Milwaukee boasts the best power play percentage in the AHL at 35.0%, led by Daniel Carr who has four goals on the man advantage.

MAGIC NUMBER = 3

After losing 5-3 at Milwaukee on Oct. 18, the Stars have not allowed more than three goals in a game since. During that six-game span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-10, including a shutout against Manitoba on Nov. 3. When keeping teams to fewer than three goals, the Stars are 3-1-1, as the defense has been their backbone through the first 10 games. Texas is allowing the fifth-fewest goals per game in the AHL at this juncture (2.40).

ON THIS DATE IN HISTORY

Nov. 15, 2017

The Texas Stars found a way past the San Antonio Rampage 4-3 on Nov. 15, 2017 at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park. The Rampage struck 28 seconds into the contest, but **Curtis McKenzie** capitalized on the power play with seven minutes to go to tie the game. AJ Greer put the Rampage up early in the second period, but McKenzie potted another one on the man advantage to even the score again. The teams traded goals in the second half of the middle stanza, with **Roope Hintz** scoring the Stars' equalizer to make it 3-3.

With six minutes to go in the final frame, **Matt Mangene** potted the eventual game-winner for Texas, as the victory propelled the Stars to win five of their next six games. **Landon Bow** earned the win after saving 26 of 29 shots. Spencer Martin was given the loss after giving up four goals on 27 shots.

The two were also teammates on Team Canada at the 2024-25 Spengler Cup roster.Texas forward Kole Lind's brother, Kalan, was drafted by the Nashville Predators with the 46th pick of the 2023 NHL draft. He currently plays for the Atlanta Gladiators, the Predators ECHL affiliate.Stars defensemen Gavin White and Admirals forward Navrin Mutter were teammates on the Hamilton Bulldogs in 2021-22.
